

Between 2021 and 2023, HFHK accelerated its growth throughout Delaware. During this time, HFHK kept programming costs stable at about 50% of the annual budget while doubling the number of participating students. That means over 17,000 students learned how to grow their own food in the 2022-2023 school year.

Delivering our valued program to more schools and students required adding two new paid staff positions and increased supplies to support our garden growth. To keep pace with this growth and programming needs, we must increase our donations, sponsorships, and monetary support so vital to our success.


